

Windhill Churches Joint Management Committee

The Joint Management Committee comprises 8 people divided equally between members of St Joseph's and St Michael's to deal with issues relating to the fabric of the building, its security, the "common areas" and the general operation of the services involved. All other matters relating to the contents and the individual operation of each Church's portion of the building is the responsibility of each Church. The chairmanship of the Committee rotates between the two Incumbents annually.

The Committee has therefore met 4 times during the year to discuss the running of the services for the Centre and to deal with the matters affecting the "common areas".

The building has continued to be a useful aide to our mission in the town being increasingly used by our own congregations as well as by other outside associated organisations.

All necessary inspections have been carried out and the required actions have been taken or are in hand. Conditions of use and legal contracts have been reviewed. Following an inspection by Precision Safety Consultants a few minor Health & Safety issues were raised and are in the process of resolution.

The Water leakage suffered in 2014 has been resolved and we are in on-going discussions with the suppliers as to the capping of the bill for the relevant period. Several other minor leakages have been dealt with.

Various maintenance duties are now being shared by Terry Pigram and Simon Leach of Home Handyman.
